

**Memorandum of Understanding**  
**Project Management for Energy Conservation at University of Phayao**  
**Between**  
**The Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA) and University of Phayao (UP)**

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is established between the Provincial Electricity Authority, represented by Mr. Sompong Preeprem, Director of the Provincial Electricity Authority, and University of Phayao, represented by Associate Professor Dr. Supakorn Pongbangpho, the President of University of Phayao.

Both PEA and UP acknowledge the crucial role of energy in driving the country's economy and sustaining the livelihoods of its citizens. Energy management for conservation is a significant government mission, and every Thai citizen can contribute by conserving energy to reduce the substantial annual energy costs incurred by the nation.

To promote awareness of the value of energy and efficient energy use, mitigate energy crises, address global warming issues, PEA and UP commit to collaborative, sustainable efforts. This collaboration will utilize appropriate technologies for both management and technology development. The goal is to achieve the outlined objectives promptly and efficiently.

In light of these considerations, PEA and UP have jointly formulated this Memorandum of Understanding to promote the Project for Energy Conservation at Phayao University, hereinafter referred to as the "Project." The key points of this understanding are as follows:

1. UP will collaborate to ensure the successful development of the energy conservation project within the organization.
2. PEA will provide support for efficient energy investment and management.
3. Both parties express the intention to collaborate on research and development to promote efficient energy use and the utilization of alternative energy sources.
4. A working committee will be established by both parties to implement the project objectives effectively.
5. Both parties will bear the respective expenses associated with their roles, including personnel costs.

6. The implementation of activities under this agreement must comply with existing laws, regulations, directives, standards, and practices of both parties.

7. This agreement is valid for two years from the signing date, and either party may extend the duration based on mutual agreement. Any extension will require signing a new version of this MoU.

8. Either party may terminate this agreement by providing written notice at least 30 days before the intended termination date. Both parties retain the right and responsibility for actions taken during the period this MoU is in effect.

This MoU is executed in two identical copies, each considered an original, in Thai. Both parties have read and understood the contents and have signed as witnesses.
